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Florence Dubois-Brissonnet is Professor of Microbiology and Food Safety in the Department of Food Science and Technology of the AgroParisTech (France) and in the joint research unit Micalis Institute (Université Paris-Saclay, INRAE, AgroParisTech). She coordinates research programs on adaptation and persistence of foodborne pathogens in refrigerated foods and food processing environments. She has developed an expertise about bacterial membrane adaptation to stresses and the consequences in terms of resistance to disinfectants and natural antimicrobial compounds.

Prof. Dubois-Brissonnet is co-director of a Master's degree program on "Food safety and risk analysis" and she is coordinator of numerous graduate programs on food microbiology, food quality, foodborne pathogens, and antimicrobial compounds. She is expert for the French Agency for Food, Environmental and Occupational Health & Safety (Anses) and vice-president of Iseki-food association which supports networking about research and education in the food sector.
